The Magnificat

[△] Luke 1:46-55

Praising God

Have you had an praise worthy experience before?

Where you could not stop praising God

Something might have happened

and you just realised here was God at work

And as a result you felt you wanted to praise God

I do not often have this

But perhaps when walking and seeing a magnificant mountain view or sea view

I want to sing to God

I often sing: O Lord my God! When I in awesome wonder, consider all the works thy hand has made...

It just wells up

And here we see Mary do the same

Even though she may not have reason to

Mary

The story of Mary and how Jesus was conceived is familiar

An angel visited her

Told her she would become pregnant

Who would be the Son of the Most High!

But Mary was already engaged!

And sex before marriage was a scandal

Especially when it would result in a pregnancy

To hear God told Mary she would be pregnant

Not by Joseph her fiancé

But by God!

When Joseph found out he would consider quietly divorcing her

But another angel told him the background and that he should not do that.

But still the stigma that would have been on Mary and on Joseph

Mary meets Elizabeth

Is this the reason that she went to visit her cousin?

To get away from it all

And live in relative anonymity

Or to be able to see what the angel said was true

and share experiences with another

woman

who also has a miraculous pregnancy And Elizabeth and the foetus recognise that Mary is pregnant And not only that Also that Mary is pregnant with the Lord The mother of my Lord And through this all the Holy Spirit is at work v35: The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you: therefore the the child to be born will be holy; he will be called the Son of God v41: .. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed: Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb.... The Holy Spirit is the director of all these events And so Mary burst out in song Also under the guidance of the Holy **Spirit** Although it does not say that, we can imply that

Mary's Song

Mary's song starts about how she has been blessed by God

But then moves on quickly to how God has blessed the world and Israel

The song has similarities to Hannah's song but there is a difference in tone

Hannah's song is a shout of triumph in the face of her enemies

Mary's a humble contemplation of the mercies of God

Hannah looks at how God has redeemed her, now at last she is pregnant

Mary's looking forward to what her pregnancy means not only to her, but also the wider world

v46-48

⁴⁶ And Mary said:

"My soul glorifies the Lord

and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

⁴⁸ for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,

for the Mighty One has done great things for me—
holy is his name.

Mary rejoices and praises God He has chosen her, not a prince or a princes But just a girl from Nazareth in Galilee perhaps the equivalent of Middlesborough Hardworking people But not well off She realises that she will become famous And yes, still generations call he blessed as the mother of the Messiah v49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name. Despite the stigma of an extramarital pregnancy Despite how the world views her She holds on to her promise made to the angel Gabriel, and therefore to God "Here I am, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word How old was Mary? How old would she have been? 14? 18? She demonstrate a high maturity for one so young But she does not grumble or accepts her lot She rejoices and she speaks of God's greatness Holy is his name

And therefore God is holy! Regardless of what will happen to me or the baby - it will be because of the Holiness of God Would anyone of us ever be so accepting of what God asks us to do? Or are we, like Moses: negotiators? But Mary was the favoured one Because she accepted God's charge? With praise From here on in Mary's song is about God And it is unclear what tense it is In Greek the verbs are in the form of an aorist This from does not have a distinct time signature NIV, NRSV have translated it as 'he has looked' in the past But it can also be translated as 'he looks' or 'he will look' It depends on the context Now the following verses clearly speak about what God has done in the past But here is also a promise and a prophecy for looking what will happen! Perhaps as often in the Bible it is both V50-52

⁵⁰ His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.

⁵¹ He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;

he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

⁵² He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.

This is for all people - all who fear him!

His mercy extends to all - all generations

That is you and me

He has / will perform might deeds

The miracles of Jesus

His resurrection and ascension

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit

The spread of Christians faith across continents

The miracles Jesus through the HS even does today

He has / will upset those who are relying on themselves for success and salvation

The tower of Babel

But also it is those who are poor, weak, humble in society who tend to more readily accept Jesus

He heals those who helieve in him

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He has brought / will bring rulers down and lift up the humble

What do we know about all the Herods (Jewish rules), Roman emporers, vs Mary, vs the fishermen in Galilee who have become the main leaders of the early church?

Finaly in v 54-55 Mary mentions her own nation: Israel

-He has helped / will help his servant Israel,

remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

With the coming of the Messiah, God remembers Israel and the promise he already gave to Abraham

Extending it even further to what Mary thought - all the nations of the world

Mary recognises that through her and her baby, God will fulfill the promise

Did she realise how?

A sword will pierce her soul to

[△] Luke 2:35b

Simeon's blessing to Mary when she presented Jesus in the temple nearly a year later

Mary was favoured

She sang of this

What do we think that God favours someone, or even us?

"Many assume that those who God favours will enjoy the things we equate with a good life: social standing, wealth and good health

Yet Mary, God's favoured one, was blessed with having a child out of wedlock, who would later be executed as a criminal

Acceptability, prospertiy, and comfort have never been the essence of God's blessing"
