Intro

Last week

We looked at Mary

And the song she sang when Elizabeth recognised that Mary was pregnant

This week

Zecheriah is in focus

Although a Priest

Maybe a person we can identify better with than Mary

He had difficulty believing the Angel Gabriel

That his wife would become pregant

as both of them were elderly

It gives him some humanity

Would we not have reacted in the same way?

The Sound of Silence

Because he did not believe, he could not speak: he became mute

He may also have been deaf, as in our passage today, the people were signing to him

Was is just a punishment?

Or was this silence not a prophetic act?

It sounds a bit like what Isaiah and Ezekiel had to do As they had to prophecy by acting something out The worst act was Ezekiel's as he could not more when his wife died So although Zecheriah's silence was not voluntary The people realised that God had spoken And this was a time of waiting, waiting in silent expectation But today we see that Zecheriah can break his silence! Birth of John the Baptist The news of the birth itself is low key A miracle in itself! No complications! Just a normal birth even though the mother is elderly And a supportive community they rejoiced with her Because God had shown her great mercy Again here also we find echoes with Hannah Who we also looked at last week Who cried out to God to become pregnant And God also showed her mercy The Circumcision and name giving

Here is where the drama is! It is the eights day, and the community comes together to circumcise the baby Take of the foreskin of the boy's penis As a indication that he is one of the people of God And with that comes the question: what is his name? As Zechariah could not speak, the community takes over This disregard the wishes of Elizabeth And want to name the baby Zechariah Was it because the baby would have normally be named already? Before this passage, children were already named before they were circumcised But Zechariah could not speak - so no name was given Do they therefore take the custom in there own hands But Elizabeth is insistant He is to be called John! Writing tablet Zechariah: "His name is John" "John is his name" Stop arguing, you can hear him think He is John! Prophecy fulfilled

And with Zecheriah's statement Angel

Gabriel's prophecy has been fulfilled Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John You - Zecheriah And the his speech was freed and he could speak, praising God! Zechariah's Prophecy Filled with the Holy Spirit Again we see the Holy Spirit at work As He comes upon Zechariah Filled upon And as a result Zechariah prophecies Three parts Part 1: Prophecy of what God will do Part 2: Prophecy how Zechariahs son: John the Baptist is involved Part 3: What is the result? Part 1: What will God do? This is the centre of Z's prophecy Not what his Son will do, but what God is about to do Z blesses God He has redeemed the people of Israel How? He has raised up a mighty saviour (or horn - symbol of strength) for us [△] v69 as promised by the OT prophets

so that Israel will be saved from
all their enemies
and from all who hate them
He has shown mercy to Israel
remembered the holy covenant with Abraham
God will rescue Israel from the hands of their enemies
So that they will serve God without fear
In holiness and righteousness
For ever
This saviour is of course Jesus!
art 2: John the Bapist's role
Prophet - of the Most High = God
But he will go before the Lord to
prepare his ways
This is God and this is Jesus!
Jesus and God are one!
So that his - God & Jesus' - people
will know salvation
through the forgiveness of sins
The means of salvation is not getting rid of the enemies of Israel
No it is through forgiveness of sins
Of Israel
It is the restoration of the relationship between Israel and God
Which can only be done through the forgiveness of Israel's sins and our sins

Part 3: The Dawn from on high

A dawn from on high

Giving light to those

who are in darkness and still under the oppresion of death

The ultimate enemy to be defeated is death

Guiding the people of Israel into peace

Echoing Isa 9:2

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.

and Isa 60:1-3

- "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you.
- ² See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you.
- ³ Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

With Jesus there will be a new dawn on the people who live in Darkness

For us?

Z's message is clearly set in the nation of Israel

And yes, Jesus is the Messiah first to Israel

But unfortunately they have not accepted

The second second	
him (yet)	
And as we can see Israel is still not	
released from their enemies and all that	
hate them	
We can only pray that they will do so soon	!
But by referencing to Isaiah, Z	
brings in a more cosmic dimension	
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Isa 60:3: Nations and kings will come to the light of Jesus	
This is not only Israel's Messiah	
This is the whole world's (all nations')	
Messiah	
Here is Z propephsying the coming of	
the Messiah	
For all peoples	
To save us all from our enemies	
And from all who hate us	
And if other people hate us, they will	
also be rescued from that hate and	
they will love us and we will love them	
The end is for us all to	
serve Jesus without fear	
As he rescues us from ourselves,	
others, destruction and even hell	
Because he has opened up the	_
relationship between us and God	
It is there: for us to accept	<u> </u>
His hand is streched out	

Do we grab it? And be saved ourselves? And what about the others? Do they know what Christmas means? They may not want to know But if no one is telling them, how can they know Or are we just like Z. Are we also struck with silence so that we cannot speak about what Jesus has done to others? Do we dare to pray for the HS to come upon us, as he came on Z. And prophesy and proclaim Jesus' good news As we burst out in singing? Amen
