Prayer and Work

Intro

We are continuing following Joshua

Last week we saw Joshua's relationship with Moses and God

And how he spend as much time with God as he could

As preperation for him to be the leader of Israel after Moses

This time we have the first mention of Joshua in the Bible

But we cannot learn much about him

Except that he was already in a leadership position

That Moses trusted Joshua to do this

And that the people respected him enough to follow him

And there is already an expectation that he would lead Israel in the future

But more about that later

The situation

The people were still travelling through the desert

But this is before the giving of the law

And the rebellion with the Golden Calf

After which God instructed the people to wanted for 40 years in the desert

They had camped at Rephidim, but there was not water.

And at this time God instructed Moses to struck the rock and water came out

As a result they were just recovering from their ordeal

And the Amalek's attacked

So it was crisis upon crisis

A little more background is given in Deut 25:17-18:

17 Remember what Amalek did to you on your journey out of Egypt, 18 how he attacked you on the way, when you were faint and weary, and struck down all who lagged behind you; he did not fear God.

So Amalek attached Israel when the were weak

They were also the first people that attacked Israel on their journey

The Plan

There is this time not a dialogue

between God and Moses

At least not as we are made aware

But Moses instructs Joshua to some men to fight Amalek the next day

We do not know how many men Amalek had

We also do not know how many men Joshua had - we just read some men

That does not sound very much

The focus is then also on what Moses does, and not what Joshua does

Moses is going to stand on the hill overlooking the battle field with his staff in his hand

This is the same staff through which God had done the miracles with Pharao

And made the water come out of the rock

The Reality

The reality may be a little different then what Moses expected

He is on the hill with his staff, but unless he lifts his staff Israel was winning

If he lowered the staff Amalek was winning

So first he has to use both hands to lift the staff And when he tires from that Aaron and Hur support him by lifting his arms, while seated And in that way Joshua and he men are winning Joshua wins It is however only at the end of the day that Joshua wins We can assume that they would have started the fighting early in the day So you can imagine how long the battle lasted We also do not see Joshua and his men in battle No Strategy No Story about what happened No heroics from the men who fought It is clear that it was not Joshua who won the battle It was Moses, together with Aaron and Hur who beseeched God to win the battle for them They did not use words in their prayer

Their prayer was to hold the staff up to

Thoughts

1. God curse on Amalek

This is what we as Western Christians find difficult

Why did God put a curse on Amalek to destroy them?

And even asked Moses the write it down and for Joshua to remember it

Some may be to do with the cowardly attack of Amalek on Israel

It may also be to ensure that all the peoples/nations around Israel are aware that these are God's people and that he will protect them

It was as much the reputation of Israel and God that helped the conquering of Caanan

Did Jesus not say to turn the other cheek when someone hits you?

But God often uses power and conquering in the course of history

Without violence the people of Israel would not have been able to conquer Canaan

But that does not mean that violence can be justified in us establishing the Kingdom of God

And often that was the case and often still is the case

But Jesus never told his followers to fight the people for the establishment of the Kingdom of God

2. Spiritual Warfare

However there is still a fight going on for the Kindom of God

And this is a spiritual fight

12 For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

And the only weapon in our arsenal for that is Prayer

18 Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints

3. Keeping on praying

And this is what Moses needed to do here

The battle was not one of people first, but it was a spiritual battle too

And it was only that Moses inteceded with God by holding up his staff that the battle was one

It was hard work for Moses and Aaron and Hur

They would have been just as tired as the fighters were

Prayer is hard work

Some of us all called to lead in that hard work of prayer But all of us can take part And God can prompt us to pray, but are we willing to listen Or you may say, this is not for me... but how do you know? Is it because it is too hard? Because I believe God all wants us to pray That is how we are in relationship with him - to talk to him 4. The Lord is my banner This story ends by Moses building an altar and calling it: The Lord is my banner The translation is a flag, or just a pole, a stake in the ground Moses could not leave the staff, but perhaps he would have used that To symbolise, that we have to gather around God and under God It not just saying that God will safe and support us It also means that we do not want to leave from under his protection We need to stay close to him and not wander off In our thoughts, words and deeds

As then we remove ourselves from his banner
